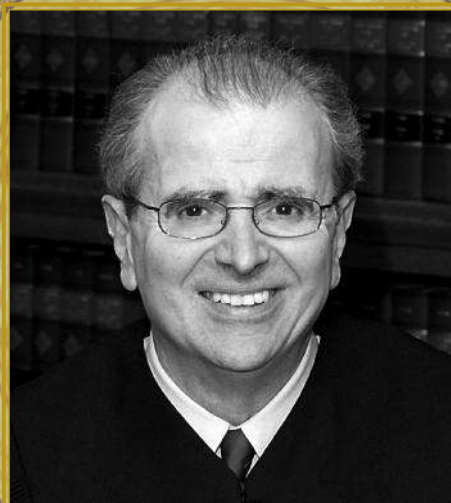

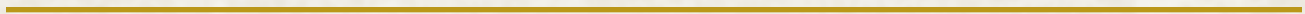

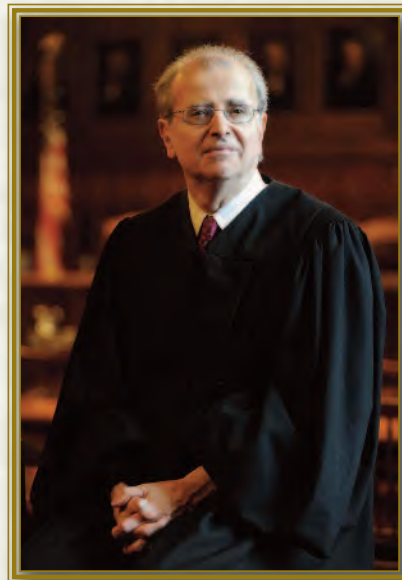

Jonathan Lippman

JONATHAN LIPPMAN was born in New York City and raised on the Lower East Side of Manhattan. A product of the New York City public school system, he received his B.A. in 1965 from New York University, from which he graduated Phi Beta Kappa and cum laude, with a major in Government and International Relations. He received his J.D. from New York University School of Law in 1968, the same year he was admitted to the New York Bar.



Chief Judge Lippman's career in the court system spans four decades, starting as an entry level court attorney in Supreme Court and including service as a law clerk in Supreme Court and Surrogate's Court. In 1977, he became Principal Court Attorney for Supreme Court, New York County, Civil Term. In 1983, he was named the Chief Clerk and Executive Officer of that court, a position he held until 1989 when he was appointed Deputy Chief Administrator for Management of the statewide court system. In 1995, he was appointed as a Judge of the New York Court of Claims by Governor George E. Pataki, who subsequently reappointed him to a full nine-year term on that court in 1998. In 2005, he was elected as a Justice of the Supreme Court for the Ninth Judicial District. He also served as an Associate Justice of the Appellate Term, Ninth and Tenth Judicial Districts. From January 1996 to May 2007, he

served, by appointment of Chief Judge Kaye, as the Chief Administrative Judge of all New York State Courts. As the longest tenured Chief Administrative Judge in state history, Judge Lippman demonstrated an extraordinary ability to promote and achieve reform. Whether the subject was modernizing the jury system, or drug treatment courts, or lawyer ethics and professionalism, or the local justice court system, or fiduciary appointments by judges, or matrimonial reform, or publishing court records on the Internet, or getting the courts through the aftermath of September 11th, or innumerable other difficult subjects, Judge Lippman played a leading role in bringing the New York courts into the twenty-first century.

In May 2007, Judge Lippman was appointed Presiding Justice of the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court, First Department, by Governor Eliot Spitzer. In that capacity, he presided over one of the most influential appellate courts in the country. The First Department's twenty Justices have jurisdiction over appeals arising from New York and Bronx Counties and hear approximately 3,000 appeals each year. As Presiding Justice, Judge Lippman also served on the Administrative Board of the Courts, the policy and rule making body of the New York State Court System.



In January 2009, Judge Lippman was appointed Chief Judge of the State of New York by Governor David A. Paterson. He was confirmed by the New York State Senate in February 2009. As Chief Judge of the State and Chief Judge of the Court of Appeals, he presides over New York's highest court while heading a statewide court system with a \$2.7 billion budget, 3,600 state and locally paid judges and over 16,000 non-judicial employees in over 350 locations around the State. In his first year at

the Court of Appeals, Judge Lippman has authored a number of significant opinions addressing constitutional, statutory and common law issues shaping the law of our state, the contours of state government and the lives of all New Yorkers.

Judge Lippman's four decades in the courts have been marked by a deep commitment to fostering a system that is independent, open, accountable and responsive

Jonathan Lippman Is the New Deputy Chief Administrator

In May, Chief Administrator of the Courts Matthew T. Crosson announced the appointment of Jonathan Lippman, Chief Clerk of the Supreme Court, Civil Term in New York County, as Deputy Chief Administrator for Management Support.

The appointment was made after consultation with the four Presidents of the Appellate Divisions of the Supreme Court and was announced on May 11, 2009.

As Chief Administrator, Lippman will be responsible for the state's judicial system. His duties will include overseeing the state's judicial system, including the Appellate Divisions, the Trial Courts, the Unified Judicial System, and the Office of the Chief Judge.

Before his appointment, Lippman served as Chief Clerk of the Supreme Court, Civil Term in New York County, for the past six years. He is a member of the New York State Bar Association and the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court of the State of New York.

Lippman has agreed to serve as Deputy Chief Administrator for the next two years, from July 1, 2009, to June 30, 2011.

to the people it serves. He has pursued these goals with a work ethic, energy and passion that can only be described as legendary. He is widely respected in legal and governmental circles for his competence, credibility and encyclopedic knowledge of the courts.

Judge Lippman is active in court improvement efforts at the national level, as a member of the Conference of Chief Judges, and as a former President of the Confer-

ence of State Court Administrators (COSCA). He also served as Vice-Chair of the Board of the National Center for State Courts. In 2008, Judge Lippman received the William H. Rehnquist Award for Judicial Excellence, presented each year by the nation's Chief Justice to a state court judge who exemplifies the highest level of judicial excellence, integrity, fairness, and professional ethics. Judge Lippman was selected for his "unparalleled ability to promote and achieve reform in the state courts. His





leadership in the New York courts has contributed to numerous improvements in that state's justice system and has served as an example for courts across the country."

Judge Lippman lectures frequently in New York and around the country, has published numerous articles and essays, and has received many awards and honors from the legal community. Judge Lippman was one of

the founding architects of The Historical Society of the Courts of the State of New York, and has been one of our most steadfast supporters from day one.

Judge Lippman resides in Manhattan and Rye Brook with his wife, Amy. Their two children, Russell and Lindsay, are also attorneys.

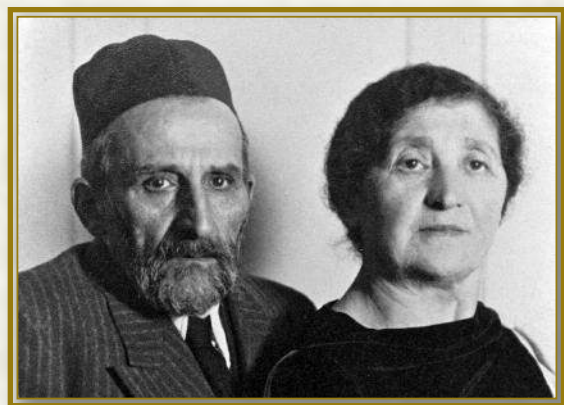
A PERSONAL BIOGRAPHY

JONATHAN LIPPMAN was born and raised on the Lower East Side of Manhattan, the third of four boys born to Ralph and Evelyn Lippman.

The Lippmans were a warm, close-knit family that valued education and hard work. As the president and manager of the nonprofit Cooperative Village on the Lower East Side, Ralph Lippman was so devoted to representing the interests of the 10,000 tenants, and so effective at dealing with City officials, that he came to be known as the “Mayor of Grand Street.” Evelyn Lippman, an English teacher, was a warm and loving mother who instilled in her sons a life-long intellectual curiosity. It is not surprising that Judge Lippman’s brothers are all highly successful professionals: Jay is an ophthalmologist, Lenny is an obstetrician, and David is the manager of a large cooperative supermarket in California.

The Lippman home was filled constantly with the conversation and laughter of a wide circle of family and friends. “Jonny,” as he is known to family members, made friends easily, played his share of city games like stickball and basketball, and was an excellent student. He attended Stuyvesant High School, began taking college courses at age 16, and received his B.A. in 1965 from New York University, from which he graduated Phi Beta Kappa and cum laude. He received his law degree from New York University School of Law in 1968.

In the summer of 1967, while serving as a counselor at Camp Oxford/Guilford in Chenango County, he met and kindled a romance with a fellow counselor, Amy Fiedler. They were married in 1969 and moved to Westchester County where they raised two children, Russell and Lindsay, both of whom are successful attorneys. The Lippmans reside today in both their apartment in New York City and their Rye Brook home.



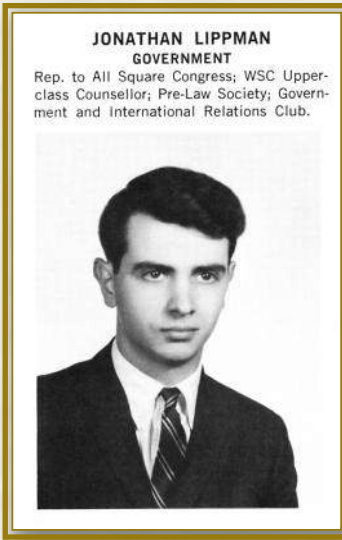

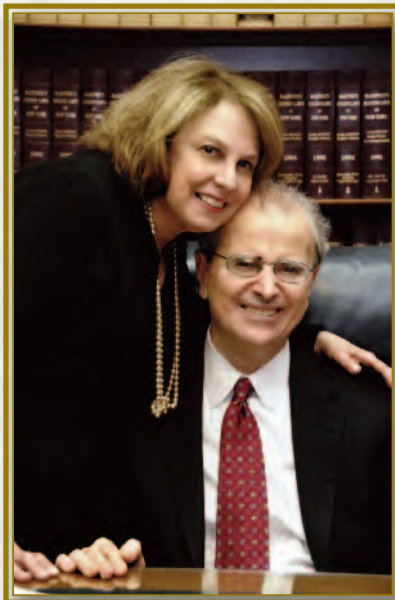
